Tribute to our closest friend, a member of Editorial Board of "Journal of Contemporary Brachytherapy", Dr. Peter Grimm.

R.I.P. Peter Douglas Grimm D.O. (1952-2016)

Dr. Peter D. Grimm, a clinical radiation oncologist who became an international leader, educator, entrepreneur, and inventor in the field of prostate cancer, died Saturday, February 20, 2016.

"Dr. Peter Grimm was a private practice physician who collaborated nationally and internationally with academic physicians and other clinical doctors to conduct research into the diagnosis and outcomes of prostate cancer treatment. His specialty was brachytherapy. Introduced in Europe, he and his partner Dr. John Blasko of the Swedish Hospital Tumor Institute Group brought it to the United States and pioneered its development and implementation in the US in the late 80's. In 2012, he left the group to establish the Prostate Cancer Treatment Center. Over his lifetime he has personally treated more than 6,000 patients and trained more than 6,000 physicians in the procedure. He travelled throughout the world giving lectures, training, and consulting with policy makers in coun-

tries such as Japan, Australia, Canada, Great Britain, Mexico, Argentina, and Spain. In addition to the numerous articles, he published in scientific journals, he was the lead author of the "Prostate Cancer Treatment Book", a handbook for patients with chapters written by an international expert in each treatment choice. He founded the Prostate Cancer Treatment Foundation, whose mission and purpose is to help patients make informed choices about treatment. It allows a patient to compare 10-year outcomes of every treatment plotted against his cancer stage utilizing the results of every article on cancer treatment published world-wide".
