"Health Psychology from a Developmental Perspective"

The special issue aims to explore aspects of health psychology from a lifespan perspective, focusing on the problems and issues related to health and illness in the development of child and adolescent populations. We invite authors to submit original research and review articles that will be a novel contribution in the field addressing a major gaps in existing body of research or providing an in depth analysis of a present state of knowledge. In this special issue, potential topics include, but are not limited to:

- The influence of an acute or chronic illness on reaching developmental milestones, fulfilling developmental tasks, and trajectories of social, personality and cognitive development.
- The understanding of the concepts of health and illness in childhood and adolescence. Implications of health and illness experiences in early childhood for future health behaviours and coping with illnesses.
- The interaction between identity development and socioemotional/physical health; understanding connection between privileged/marginalized social identities and overall health among youth.
- Health concerns impacting education and school adaptation.
- Health risk behaviours in adolescence.
- Impact of childhood chronic illness and mental health issues on family functioning.
- Physical and mental health promotion among children and youth with and without developmental disabilities.
