This includes, but is not limited to manuscripts that evaluate the relationship of personality/identity with quality of life, well-being, interpersonal relations, and behavior dynamics. In addition, potential authors are welcome to consider contributions which evaluate individual differences, disorders, development, assessment, and diagnosis of personality and identity. Novel contributions from underrepresented cultures/regions as well as multicultural contexts are most welcome as to provide an in depth analyses of what is currently known and address major gaps in the field of personality and identity psychology.

30 September 2016	Feedback from first round of reviews to authors
